FernFH: High distinction for Viennese industrial psychologist

Peter Radlingmayr received the title "FH-Dozent"

"Generally, I do not really care about academic titles. But to be awarded with the "FH-Dozent" title at the Distance-Learning University of Applied sciences for me means that my enthusiasm for teaching and my work with the students has been recognised", says Peter Radlingmayr after having received the distinction. The industrial psychologist and psychotherapist has been teaching in both the bachelor and master degree programmes in "Business Administration and Psychology" at the FernFH since 2010. He was recently awarded the title "FH-Dozent" for his achievements and services from Austria's first Distance-Learning University of Applied Sciences. "Peter Radlingmayr confronts and engages his students with current issues from real life with his expertise, while creating an awareness for state-of-the-art research at the same time," says Christa Walenta, Deputy Head of Academic Board at FernFH. Furthermore, Radlingmayr continuously introduces his network of partner companies and advisory clients into his teaching and takes great care to support his students in finding future clients to collaborate with.

Peter Radlingmayr has worked as a psychologist within the human resources area for more than 25 years. He started teaching at FernFH ten years ago, because it offers him the opportunity to pass on his extensive experience and expertise in a practice-oriented way. "And, if I may add: the diversity of my students has always enriched my life, both personally and professionally", he reveals, and admits that working with students who are already experienced in a professional context often poses challenges for him. At the same time, however, it also allows for an enriching exchange at eye level.

The recent distinction is already the second award that Radlingmayr received for his work at FernFH. In 2015, the psychologist won the price for "Exzellentes Distance Learning" for his course on "Talent Management". Now, being honoured with the "FH-Dozent" title, Radlingmayr feels nostalgic. "The Ferdinand Porsche FernFH has become my academic home. With this title, I see it – even more than before – as my job to integrate the unique FernFH culture – the respect and appreciation for and interest in one another – into my teachings."

Ferdinand Porsche FernFH is Austria's first Distance-Learning University of Applied Sciences and was founded in 2006. Through innovative forms of learning and teaching in the field of blended learning, FernFH takes on a pioneering role in distance learning in Austria. It currently offers five federally funded degree programmes, which are accredited by AQ Austria, the Agency for Quality Assurance and Accreditation Austria. FernFH was also certified according to international standards by the evaluation agency evalag Baden-Württemberg in 2016. Like other Austrian Universities of Applied Sciences, the FernFH collects the statutory tuition fees of 363.36 Euros per semester plus student union fee from its students. In addition to its degree programmes, FernFH also offers executive education in the form of master, diploma and certificate programmes. Preparations for further degree programmes and executive education programmes are currently underway. The FernFH is a subsidiary organisation of the FernFH Management & Service GmbH.
